This cultural space provides a place for ceremony, dialogue and exchange for Indigenous students living in residence, accessible using their Campus Card.





Teraanga Commons Dining Hall: A fresh dining experience

Teraanga Commons Dining Hall is Carleton University's newly renovated dining experience located in the residence precinct and available to all students and members of the Carleton community. The Dining Hall offers students a wide variety of menu options to choose from **15 unique stations**.

A station free from nine of the major allergens, True Balance, is perfectly suited for those with dietary restrictions, allergies and intolerances. Our popular deli station features house-made sandwiches and now offers hot protein options like the Canadian favourite Montreal Smoked Meat. We're also proud to offer halal-certified protein options, and a full vegan station that's open to students who require dietary accommodations or those just looking to try something new. Students are able to visit the Dining Hall to find menu items that fit their dietary needs, all of which are made fresh in-house every day.

Information for parents and families

We value parents, families and supporters in encouraging student success and personal growth.

What to expect

Students may experience homesickness at the beginning of the university transition, and you may receive a higher frequency of phone calls directly after the move into residence. It will take them some time to get used to living with a new roommate, adjusting to a new routine or navigating cultural differences.

How You Can Help

- Consider sending the student a care package to remind them that you are thinking of them.
- When the student calls home unexpectedly, please don't worry. It may be to say hello and hear a familiar voice.
- If the student calls with a personal or academic concern, listen and encourage them to approach our staff for support.
 Our Residence Fellows can mediate conflict and offer helpful resources.

- If you plan to visit the student, please let them know you are coming. You cannot gain access to the student's room without their consent and presence.
- Sometimes the student may experience facilities concerns. Encourage them to complete a work order so our facilities team can fix the issue as soon as possible.

Direct Communication

It is important that the student connects with us directly so we can talk to them about their concerns and provide them with effective solutions and support.

Stay Connected

Ensure you have contact information for the student before moving to residence. The transition to university can be difficult, and we engage students with activities and initiatives to help them adjust. It is normal that a student may be too busy to respond to your text or call right away.

Privacy Policy

We can provide you with policy and procedural information. However, we cannot provide you with information about the student as outlined in the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FIPPA). This includes room numbers, student conduct history, account balances, grades, roommate conflicts, addresses, etc. If you would like to know this information, we encourage you to discuss these questions or concerns with the student directly.



How much will residence cost?

Your residence fees cover a fully furnished room, internet connection, utilities and meal plan. For all first-year students, meal plan are mandatory. Residence fees also cover support services, security, fun activities and an inspiring community.

Application process and dates

First-year guaranteed room acceptance process



May 16, 2025

All current secondary school students and CEGEP students entering their first year who are admitted on or before May 16, 2025, and accept the offer by the deadline indicated are guaranteed a double traditional room



June 9, 2025

The deadline to accept a first-year guaranteed residence offer and pay the \$700 Residence Advanced Payment is 11:59 p.m. Eastern Time (ET) on June 9, 2025. After accepting your offer of admission to Carleton, please log onto the Housing Portal and accept your guaranteed residence offer.

Non-guaranteed room application process



June 9, 2025

After accepting your offer of admission to Carleton, log onto the Housing Portal to submit your residence application and pay the non-refundable application fee of \$50.

Room selection process

After accepting the offers of admission and residence, students receive time tickets which allow them to connect with potential roommates and select their room on the Housing Portal.
